



Here's some fun drama-based activities for you to try at home! How many of the activities can you complete?

#### Number One

Create your favourite movie scene with someone at home. Create costumes for the characters and for the background from items you have lying around in the house.

#### Number Two

Get the whole family together and create your own story... it can be about absolutely anything! There are only two rules in the storytelling game:

1. Each part must make sense with what has happened in the story before
2. Each person can only say one sentence at a time.

Once you've finished your story, why not grab some colouring pencils and paper and turn it into your own comic book story?

#### Number Three

Why not get to know some of your favourite characters a little bit better? Pick a character from a book or a television programme/movie and pretend to be them.

Get a chair and put it in front of your sofa. Have all of your family sit on the sofa and you sit on the chair. Let them ask you questions and you answer them in character, it doesn't matter if you don't know the answer... just make it up!

If you really enjoy this game you can even make up your own characters instead of using ones that else made!

#### Number Four

If it is a nice, sunny day why not head out into your garden and make a mini theatre set out of the things you find?

You could make a forest from some sticks, or a city out of stones or anything else your imagination can come up with!

If it's not a nice day and you would still like to try this challenge, then try it inside with objects that you can find. What sort of play do you think would happen on the stage you've made?

#### Number Five

In drama we often work together to make short stories or scenes!. These can be about anything and often are quite silly or fun!

As an extra at home at challenge, can you come up with your own short scene? Instead of performing it in a room with lots of other people, you could maybe get someone in your house to film it. Can you play more than one character?
